## **Edna Cox Fund Committee Report:**

The Edna Cox Fund Committee (ECF) met on March 30 to determine the recipients of this fund. Committee members are Chair; Ruth Rafello, President Harriett Beck, Treasurer Barbara Von Glahn and members Delores Crabb and Erika Pardo. As mandated by our policy \$2000 for a local scholarship, \$900 for one Tech Trekker, \$1000 to fund our summer STEM workshop will be given and an addition this year \$100 to fund a teacher as sponsored by the HMB Chamber of Commerce, of which we are a member. Three teacher grants are also to be awarded before this goes to press. Linda Herbert, kindergarten-first grade teacher at Farallone View, will receive \$500 to complete the purchase of Imagination Blocks for which the students have already raised about \$2000. Lizeth Bendana from Pilarcitos Alternative School will receive \$1500 for the first ever yearbook for the school and Amy Traenor, head of the math department of Half Moon Bay High School will receive \$403.90 to purchase two sets of Zoom kits to study how volume and other spatial problems look in the real world to be used by all math classes with the new Common Core curriculum. This is one more example of how our branch makes a real difference in our school community, thanks to our charter member, the late Major Edna L. Cox (retired).

## **AAUW Public Policy:**

Did you know that according to AAUWs just published report "SOLVING THE EQUATION", less women are in technology and engineering now than in the past? (12% in engineering and 26% in computer science). Here is something unbelievable, according to this report, 30% of businesses will hire a male over a female, even though he may NOT BE AS QUALIFIED!!

AAUW is holding TWO elections this year, state and national. The national elections will be held from April 15-June 19th. In your latest edition of OUTLOOK, you can read about the candidates and the 5 proposed by- law changes. The by-law change that will most impact AAUW members is the proposal to extend membership to anyone who supports AAUW's mission and pays their dues. This means that, if passed, the requirement for an AA degree or better will no longer be necessary to join AAUW. On the back of your OUTLOOK, you will find your AAUW ID # and your PIN # to vote electronically.

AAUW CA will have voting from April 18-May 8. There is one by-law change they are asking you to vote on, to make it easier to replace an elected state officer, if that person resigns. You can go on the AAUW CA web site to read about this and also to read about the candidates for state office. Several offices both national and state are contested this time, so it is important for you to vote to insure you have a voice in what you want your organization to focus on during the next two years.

If you do not have email, you should be receiving a card in the mail, that you need to send back to request a paper ballot. The deadline to mail paper ballots is May 26. If you need help in understanding how to vote, please contact us and we will be happy to help.

CA SB358 is one of 30 bills that AAUW CA is supporting, after reviewing over 200 . SB 358 is about Fair Pay and is heavily supported by AAUW CA. Let your congress person know that you support this bill. On the national front, the Fair Pay Check Act has been reintroduced to the US Congress. This also needs our support, so send those emails or call your congress person. AAUW Public Policy will focus more on fair pay this year than any other public policy issue.
